The District Board of Health Mahoning County is sponsoring a rabies vaccination clinic for dogs, cats and ferrets. "These clinics are part of the Board of Health's ongoing efforts to protect our families and their pets against the threat of rabies in wildlife," said Mahoning County Health Commissioner Matthew Stefanak. The clinics are being offered in cooperation with the Dog Warden, Angels for Animals and volunteer veterinarians in the community. Rabies vaccination of all dogs, cats and ferrets over three months of age is required in the Mahoning County General Health District.

No appointment is necessary for the clinics. **DOG OWNERS MUST HAVE THEIR DOGS UNDER LEASH.** Cat owners should have their cats caged or carried in a cloth pillowcase. A \$4.00 fee will be charged to recover the cost of supplies.
